She was very involved in the school activity program through serving as a student council sponsor and volleyball coach and helped with gymnastics. Since her retirement in 1998, she has volunteered at Morton Elementary and Ezra Millard Elementary. She sews mittens for children which are distributed through various charities. In 2011 the College of

Education at the University of Nebraska at Omaha acknowledged Bob and Mary's continuing dedication to children, education, and the Omaha community by presenting them with the Lifetime Achievement Award. ## Caryl and Catherine Brown Memorial Scholarship

Caryl and Katherine Brown viewed education as the answer to many of the challenges they encountered during the Great Depression and World War II years. Throughout their 49-year marriage, they supported public education with involvement in PTA activities at Omaha's Miller Park elementary school and maintained that interest as their son, Richard D., advanced into activities at Omaha North and later, at UNO. Public education was the utmost importance

to them. For example, during the final years of his life, Caryl Brown – then in his early 90's – would consistently encourage his caregivers at Silvercrest Assisted Living to continue pursuits for additional levels of certification and degrees. Richard, who started his career as a journalist, joined the Millard High (now Millard South) faculty in 1973 and taught advanced placement social studies and speech communication. Special Requirements: 1. Three (3) \$2,500 scholarships will be awarded. One (1) will be awarded to a graduate of Millard South High School. One (1) will be awarded to a graduate of Millard North High School. One (1) will be awarded to a graduate of Millard West High School. 2. The scholarship is open to students with a grade point average of 3.5 or higher and an ACT score of 20-29. 3. Scholarship recipients will not earn more than \$4,000 in accepted scholarships. Student applicants shall have completed two academic years in the Millard School system and be eligible to graduate at the end of the current school year.
